Projects that take a whole-building approach and incorporate multiple building shell and/or energy management system upgrades may qualify for higher incentive rates.

To qualify, your project must include two or more eligible improvements that work together to improve building performance.

Eligible Project Categories

Building Envelope⁺

Incentives are available for a variety of building shell improvements.

- Insulation upgrades
- Window improvements
- Air sealing

Energy Management System⁺

Optimize how your building operates.

- Energy management systems
- Building automation systems
- HVAC distribution improvements

Hard-to-Electrify Gas⁺

For uncommon cases where electrification isn't feasible.

- High efficiency gas heating systems
- Must be paired with additional efficiency upgrades

Hard-to-Electrify Gas⁺	\$1/LMMBtu saved

Incentives are calculated on a lifetime, per-measure basis, converted into MMBtu saved.
