25% Payment

• Schedule Site Visit

• At the site visit, team will review pole layout, POI configuration, easements, license agreements, and current project documentation

Project Schedule

• Utility to provide developer with preliminary project schedule

Utility Design Review

- Developer to submit any site plan modifications
- Estimating team begins the design for the project and identifies any necessary easements/permits that might be required



75% Payment

• Site Visit with Utility

- Stake poles and anchors (once access road installed)
- Utility to provide final project schedule

Easement(s)/Permits(s)

- Central Hudson will prepare any necessary easements/license agreements for the project and obtain any necessary permits
- Developer will complete the easements with property owner and submit original to PM

Complete Project Design

- Utility to finalize the design
- Procure project materials and equipment
- Schedule utility construction with operations



Mechanical Completion/Post Construction

New Account Creation

- Developer to complete new commercial account application
- Provide the Underwriter permit for meter pan (cut in card)

Energization

- Submit the electrical inspection for the DG system
- Utility to set meter and program the recloser
- Self Verification Test [Recommended for developer to have a relay technician on site during this test]

Final Witness Test

- Once a successful Self Verification Test is completed, developer can submit for final witness testing through PowerClerk.
- Provide As-Builts and any other outstanding paperwork
- Permission to Operate letter after project review and successful final witness test

Reconciliation

• Reconciliation statement provided within 60 days



Key Points

- Earlier outreach is better
- Be transparent with schedule and any permitting challenges
- Have subject matter experts on site for testing
- Provide contact information for O&M activities (following interconnection)
- If CDG, provide necessary documentation 60 days prior to PTO
