

How much distributed solar was installed in 2024?




Statewide MW Built Annually, By Project Size




2024 Solar Deployment by Utility (MW)

- > Overall deployment is driven by upstate Community Solar
- > All utilities saw meaningful residential deployment



Central Hudson MW Built Annually, By Project Size




- CDG deployment has contracted
- Residential deployment, although lower than 2023 level, was higher than earlier years

Price per Watt Over Time

Both residential and C/I price per Watt values remain steady, due to

- > Inflation
- High cost of capital (residential loans and CDG financing)
- Increasing interconnection and siting costs (C/I)
- > High customer acquisition costs



NYSERDA Updates – Beyond 10 GW

- > NY State is on track to achieve 10 GW of distributed solar installed by 2030
- > NYSERDA has posted the final MW blocks authorized by the 10 GW Order
 - Added 32MW at \$0.15/Watt to Residential block structure
 - Added 83MW at \$0.05/Watt to C/I block structure
- > NYSERDA has proposed using a projected ~\$346M surplus for LMI-focused solar, this is pending review by the PSC
- > Attempting to roll out \$250M for LMI residential and CDG later this year through Federal EPA Solar For All grant
- > NYSERDA is currently evaluating options for maintaining Affordable Solar, GJGNY, and Solar Quality Installer for residential PV once the final block closes

Statewide Solar For All

- > S-SFA is now open!
- > New offering for community solar (and storage)
 - Utility automatically allocates VDER bill credits to pool of income-eligible households
 - No need to project developer/owner acquire, manage, replace, bill customers
 - Project owner receives direct monthly payment from utility (87% of Value Stack for PV and paired, 76% if receiving Energy Communities tax credit, 94% if standalone storage
- > Utilities are currently accepting project enrollments (through Central Hudson's Powerclerk portal)
- > NYSERDA now offering <u>\$0.07/Watt S-SFA incentive adder</u>. Available for PV projects that did not receive MTC, CC, or CA.
